	Poland	Yes	Polish statistic provides information on citizenship of the spouses, however does not provide information on citizenship of the parents. What is available is only the information on a country of permanent residence abroad of a mother who temporarily resides in Poland.

	Slovenia	Yes	Information available in both cases.
	Slovak Republic	Yes	Statistical Office of the Slovak Republic processes demographic data of persons with permanent residency in the SR. It means that: - in case of marriage of a Slovak citizen (with permanent residence permit in the SR) with a foreigner, nationality data of both are registered. - nationality of a child is processing based on the nationality of a mother, if she has a permanent residence permit in the SR at the time of the birth of the child
	Finland	Yes	Marriages: Yes, Births: partly, the mother's nationality is known for all births but only if the couple is a married couple at the time of child birth then we also know the father's nationality.
	Sweden	Yes	Partner's citizenship is registered at marriage, and parents' citizenship is registered at the birth of their child/children – yet ONLY if the partner/parent has been registered is in the Swedish population registration/national registration.
	United Kingdom	Yes	Questions are asked about nationality at marriage notification, but marriage notification data are not processed for statistical purposes. The UK does not collect information on parents' nationality at birth registration. However, information is collected on the country of birth of the mother and the father (where the father is entered on the birth certificate).

	Czech Republic	Yes	The Czech Statistical Office (CZSO) updates time series on demographic events of foreigners every year and publishes them in the yearbook Foreigners in the Czech Republic and on CZSO population's website.

	Germany	Yes	The German Federal Statistical Office regularly publishes shortened contingency tables of spouses and parents. For detailed tables it is necessary to make special requests.
	Estonia	Yes	No, the cross tabulations are not regularly published in Estonia. However, it is possible to compile such tabulations on a special request.

	Greece	Yes	Presently, the tables are not published, but are available upon request.
	Spain	Yes	National Statistics Institute publishes those tables among others, every year.
	France	Yes	Those kind of statistics are not published but are available through a non free special request (fees for tailor made tables).

	Latvia	Yes	The Central Statistical Bureau (CSB) of Latvia annually publishes these tables in the statistical data collection "Demography".

	Luxembourg	Yes	Some data (most represented nationalities) are published. More detailed tables can be delivered on request.
	Hungary	Yes	The cross tables of the citizenship of spouses and parents are published annually in the Demographic yearbook. (please find enclosed the latest tables)

	Netherlands	Yes	No, cross tabulations of the nationalities of spouses and parents are not published on a regular basis. However, the Central Bureau for Statistics can make these available on special request.
	Austria	No	This EMN NCP has provided a response to the requesting EMN NCP. However they have requested that it is not disseminated further
	Poland	Yes	In case of spouses, it is indeed possible to prepare cross-tabulations. These however are not published.
	Portugal	Yes	Statistics Portugal annually publishes such tables as part of its <i>Demographic Statistics</i> publication.
	Romania	Yes	
	Slovenia	Yes	Cross tabulation could be prepared on a special request. It is planned to be part of regular tabulation in the future.
	Slovak Republic	Yes	So far, data on nationalities of spouses as well as nationalities of mothers at the time of the birth of the child were not published. However, the Statistical Office of the SR is currently preparing extension of a Demographic Yearbook which will include also item "nationality" in relation to all demographic phenomenon (e.g. birth, marriage, divorce, death, moving – which were gradually prepared

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			from a reference year 2003). 	Finland	Yes	Marriages, partly: we do have annual table but it's not a full table in a sense that the other spouse is always a Finnish woman or man. Births: only annual table of the mother's nationality.
	Sweden	Yes	This type of statistics is available, yet it seems not to be published in any particular publication and it would therefore be more convenient to request such information (see further next question and answer).
	United Kingdom	Yes	Marriage data on nationality: Data are not collected on nationality (or country of birth, or citizenship) at marriage registration. Questions are asked about nationality at marriage notification, but marriage notification data are not processed for statistical purposes. Nationality at birth of child data: The Office for National Statistics routinely publishes births by mothers' country of birth, (not nationality).

	United Kingdom	Yes	Marriage data on nationality: Data are not collected on nationality (or country of birth, or citizenship) at marriage registration. Nationality data is collected on the registration form on "residence at the time of marriage" but this is not currently used to produce statistical outputs by residence. Nationality at birth of child data: The Office for National Statistics routinely publishes births by mothers' country of birth (not nationality)for E&W - see http://www.statistics.gov.uk/statbase/Product.asp?vlnk=14408 (FM1 chapter 9 and mothers' COB links).
